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Dear Parent(s) / Carer(s)

We are two weeks into the second half of the Autumn term and on the whole it has been a really positive and calm return to school. We have started to see a shift in the weather so can I ask parents to ensure their children wear a proper black, red or white coat to school and not a hoodie and check they have the correct black, leather polishable school shoes, in order to keep them warm and dry.

#### Parents' Behaviour

Recently, there have been instances where the tone of communication between parents and school staff has become strained. Unfortunately a small minority of our KS3 parents believe that it is acceptable to be rude and abusive to our staff and use language that is not appropriate for students, let alone adults. I appreciate that parents may struggle with understanding the changes from primary to secondary school and the expectations of their children as they become older and more independent. However, please allow your children to learn from their mistakes and not cover for them as later down the line it often becomes a problem at home. An example would be covering for missing items etc. Staff are more than willing to work with parents;but this must be respectful and at a minimum civil. If this continues I will be left with no option but to take further action against those parents. Remember, the staff at our school are dedicated to the well-being and academic success of your child. We believe that maintaining a positive and respectful relationship between parents and staff is crucial for creating a supportive learning environment.

### **Parking**

Unfortunately we are being inundated with complaints from local residents with the way parents are

- Blocking their driveways
- Parking across the zebra crossing
- Stopping in the middle of the road to let students in/out of cars
- Encouraging students to run cross the road
- Being abusive to residents when asked to move.



Please can I ask parents to be mindful, put yourselves in their shoes, imagine if this your street or home address and these things are taking place, how would you feel. Please can I ask parents to be more considerate of the neighbours when coming to collect your daughters, can I suggest that you park further away and walk down to meet them or get them to walk up and meet you.

Residents have put in numerous complaints to the council and police. We really do not want the surrounding roads to become residents parking only/red routes and in one case I have heard of adding sections of Norbury Crescent to the school street system.

We appreciate that some of our senior students have period 6 lessons and whilst the majority of the time that is not an issue we know that as we move towards winter, the Muslim prayer timings shift thus making the window of time to pray tighter.
