Because of what is going on with Covid-19 it will seem more of a challenge to you. And you will be missing out on having an induction day. I'm sure the teachers will come up with a way of making sure that you get the time to get to know your classmates and the new surroundings.

What I learned on Induction Day

I learned my teacher's names, what clubs there are and where the lunch room is but all of these things will come up again on the first day so you have nothing to worry about. There is also a big chance that in the coming school year the clubs will be done differently or that we will not know what clubs will be available and in what form until we are all back at school in September.

. **Do your homework** - if teachers know you have a good work ethic they might be more lenient with you later on
