WorldViews at Norbury High School

Overview: The aim of WorldViews is to provide students with a broad understanding of the different faiths and lifestyles people follow world wide. KS4 WorldViews

There is no formal GCSE exam or qualification. Instead the focus is on continuing to enrich students on the various similarities and differences in beliefs worldwide. Students will study a variety of both religions and alternative beliefs. This includes exploring Christianity, Humanism, Islam, Paganism and many more.
